Esther Saved Her People

Bible Passage: Esther

Story Point: God made Esther a queen to protect His people.

Key Passage: “The God of all grace, who called you to his eternal glory in Christ, after you have suffered a little while, will himself restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast.” 1 Peter 5:10

Christ Connection: God had a plan for Esther to rescue His people. By saving the Jews, God made the way for His Son, Jesus, to come into the world.

Big Picture Question: Who is in control of everything? God is in control of everything in heaven and on earth.

LEADER BIBLE STUDY

The Babylonian captivity ended when Cyrus, the king of Persia, took over Babylon and let God’s people go home. Some of God’s people—now called Jews (people from Judah)—traveled back to Judah to rebuild the temple, the city, and their lives. Others, however, stayed in Persia where life among the pagans was relatively comfortable.

The king of Persia was now Ahasuerus (uh haz yoo EHR uhs), also known by his Greek name, Xerxes (ZUHRK seez). Esther was a young Jewish girl who became queen of Persia. The former queen had defied the king and was promptly replaced.

Esther had been an orphan, so her cousin Mordecai adopted her. Mordecai kept in touch with Esther while she lived in the palace. One day, the king gave Haman the Agagite a very important position in the kingdom. The king even commanded the people to bow down to Haman. But Mordecai refused.

Haman was a descendant of Agag, king of the Amalekites. The nations of Israel and Amalek did not get along. Haman was angry, but instead of just punishing Mordecai, he planned to kill all the Jews in the kingdom.

In today's Bible story, Mordecai turned to Esther for help. After all, she was in a position of power, and the Jews were her people. The stakes were high, but Esther approached the king and explained her people's plight. Review the details in Esther 7.

Note how Esther described Haman: "The adversary and enemy is this evil Haman" (Esth. 7:6). We too have an adversary—the Devil. He prowls around like a lion, seeking people to devour. (1 Pet. 5:8) He loves nothing more than to destroy believers and hinder the work of God. Satan thought he had succeeded when Jesus died on the cross, but God—working frequently behind the scenes—raised Jesus from the dead and defeated Satan once and for all. (See Heb. 2:14-15.)

KID CONNECT

WELCOME TIME

(VIDEO: INTRO/OUTRO MUSIC)

Greet each kid as he or she arrives. Prompt kids to discuss a time when they helped someone else. How did kids feel afterward? How did the other person react? Has helping someone ever been difficult or scary?

LARGE GROUP

COUNTDOWN

(VIDEO: COUNTDOWN)

Show the countdown video as you transition to Large Group. Set it to end as the session begins.

LARGE GROUP GAME

(SFX: GAME INTRO MUSIC, SFX: FOOD MUSIC)

A FEAST FIT FOR A KING...OR BABY

(5 Pairs of Baby Food, 10 Plastic Spoons, 2 Blindfolds, 2 Chairs, Table, Allergy Alert)

SAY • Hey guys! Welcome back to KidCity! I need 4 volunteers for our game - 2 kids and 2 Small Group Leaders...who maybe are a little hungry. Yep! You're going to be eating some food, Small Group Leaders, but not just any food. *reveal jars on the table without showing what kinds they are* Baby food! Who's up for the challenge? *Choose 2 kids and 2 SGL's. If you have to, convince them!*

Ok! Give a round of applause to our hungry Small Group Leaders! This game is called A Feast Fit for a King...or Baby. We will be learning about an actual feast for a king in our Bible story,

so this is a perfect game! Here's how it works. I will blindfold the 2 Small Group Leaders and then our 2 kids will feed them one spoonful of the same type of baby food. Whichever Small Group Leader can guess out loud what kind of food it is first, gets a point. Then we will move on to a new flavor of baby food. The first team to get 3 points wins! Make sense? I hope you're hungry. Let's play A Feast Fit for a King...or Baby!

WORSHIP

(VIDEO: THIS LITTLE LIGHT, VIDEO: GOD IS ON THE MOVE)

SAY • Let's worship God!

INTRODUCE THE SESSION

(CG: IMAGES OF GAMES)

(No Supplies)

SAY • Hey guys! Raise your hand if you like video games. Me too! Raise your hand if you like board games...also known these days as tabletop games. Nice! Well, I love games and gaming. I'm not the best at them but that doesn't stop me from playing them. One of my favorite things to do in games is build stuff. Who can tell me some video games where you build stuff?

Take responses from the kids. Most likely some of them will mention these but if they don't, you can bring them up.

Yes, in Minecraft you build. That whole game revolves around building things actually. What else? Yes, you build in Fortnite. You can build walls and stairs and floors.

Does anyone know any *board* games where you build things? In Jenga, you build a tall tower while trying not to knock it down. How about Settlers of Catan? You use resources like lumber, brick and wool to build roads and houses.

I love all of these games! But you know what? Each one requires that I have some sort of plan...or blueprint *before* I actually start building. The better my plan, the better my building will be.

And you know what? That reminds me of God; He always has a plan! I want to share a Bible story with you about a dangerous situation. In this story, God had a plan to protect His people.

BIG PICTURE QUESTION

(CG: BIG PICTURE QUESTION)

SAY • As we listen to our Bible story, it's also useful to have a big picture question to help us understand how the individual story fits in to the overall story of the Bible. Today let's try to ask the question: Who is in control of everything?

Think about this question as you listen to the story and we'll talk about the answer in a few minutes.

GIANT TIMELINE

(CG: GIANT TIMELINE)

Show the giant timeline. Point to individual Bible stories as you review.

SAY • After the exile was over, the Israelites went back to Jerusalem to rebuild the temple. When the Israelites stopped rebuilding, God sent the prophet Zechariah to talk to them. God told Zechariah His plan for the Israelites, and Zechariah reminded the Israelites of God's good plan for them. Zechariah reminded the Israelites to return to God. Many years went by between Zechariah and the story we will hear today. A group of God's people stayed in Persia while the temple was being rebuilt in Judah. Persia started to become a dangerous place for the Jewish people, but God had a plan to protect His people. Check it out.

WATCH THE BIBLE STORY

(VIDEO: ESTHER SAVED HER PEOPLE, CG: BIBLE STORY PICTURE, CG: STORY POINT)
(Bible)

Show the Bible story video "Esther Saved Her People."

SAY • Can you imagine being in Esther's shoes? She showed a lot of bravery in approaching the king. She could have been killed. Do you remember who helped Esther understand what she needed to do? Mordecai told Esther what Haman had planned. When Esther wasn't sure what to do, Mordecai encouraged her to take a step of faith. Mordecai also fasted with Esther. Mordecai helped Esther understand that God made Esther a queen to protect His people.

Mordecai was a loyal friend and relative who helped Esther make the right decision. When Esther became queen of Persia, she did not know what her future would hold. But God had a plan for Esther and for His people. Esther was in a hard situation, but she had faith in God. Even when she wasn't sure what God's plan was, she trusted Him.

CHRIST CONNECTION

(CG: CHRIST CONNECTION, BIG PICTURE QUESTION)

Note: You may use this opportunity to use Scripture and the guide provided to explain how to become a Christian. Make sure kids know when and where they can ask questions.

SAY • God had a plan for Esther to rescue His people. By saving the Jews, God made the way for His Son, Jesus, to come into the world.

Do you remember our big picture question? Who is in control of everything? God is in control of everything in heaven and on earth. God was in control over Haman's evil plan to destroy the Jews. Like Haman, Satan wants to destroy followers of Jesus. He thought he had

won when Jesus died on the cross, but God raised Jesus from the dead and defeated Satan once and for all.

KEY PASSAGE

(CG: KEY PASSAGE)

(Bible)

Show the key passage slide. Lead the kids to read together 1 Peter 5:10.

SAY • This verse describes God as “the God of all grace.” God shows us favor and love we do not deserve. God does not promise that we will never suffer, but He does promise to restore us and heal us. The Jews would have died at the hands of Haman, but God protected them through Esther’s bravery. God showed them grace and kindness by keeping them safe from Haman’s evil plan.

PRAY AND DISMISS TO SMALL GROUPS

SMALL GROUP

Bible Passage: Esther

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KEY PASSAGE ACTIVITY

(Key Passage Poster, 1 per group)

Help the kids learn the key passage with motions. Stand in a circle with the kids and teach them the motions. Once you have gone through the whole verse together, consider having a kid do the motion for the first phrase; then the kid to her right will do the motion for the second phrase, and so on until kids say the whole verse. Repeat as time allows.

“The God of all grace (*point up*), who called you (*cup hand over ear*) to his (*point up*) eternal glory in Christ (*stretch arms out wide*), after you after you have suffered a little while (*roll fists in front*) will (*pump fist upwards*) himself (*point up*) restore you and make you strong, firm and steadfast (*flex arms*)” 1 Peter 5:10 (*open hands like a book*).

SAY • Have you ever gone through something really difficult and you weren’t sure if you would ever get through it? (*Allow for responses.*) Our key passage reminds us that God will help us

and make us strong. The word restore means to fix something broken and make it new again. God knows that we need help, but when we are weak, He is strong. God used Esther and God want to use us too.

PAPER PEOPLE PUPPETS

(“Paper People Puppet” printable, 1 set per kid, Scissors, Glue or Tape, Craft Sticks, 4 per kid)

Assist the kids in cutting out the Bible story people from the printable. Instruct the kids to glue or tape each person onto a craft stick. Form small groups of three to five kids and allow them to use their puppets to retell the story within their groups.

SAY • God made Esther a queen to protect His people. At the time, it seemed like all hope was lost for the Jews. They fasted, which mean they prayed and did not eat to show they were depending on God’s faithfulness, and God acted. God showed Himself to be faithful to His people and protected them from their enemies.

DISCUSSION

(Bibles)

Distribute Bibles to your group. Help kids find the Book of Esther. Explain that Esther is in the Old Testament.

Read Esther 2:10-11 to the kids. Ask the following questions. Lead the group to discuss:

How was Esther able to save her people? *Guide kids to recall that Esther, a Jew, was chosen to be the queen of Persia. The king did not know she was a Jew, and Esther rose to a position where she could ask the king to protect her people. (Option: Read 1 Cor. 1:26-28.)*

How does Esther remind us of Jesus? *Lead kids to recognize that God raised up Esther to save His people. Mordecai urged Esther to take action, and she was willing to face death for them. In a greater way, God sent Jesus at just the right time and Jesus willingly died on the cross to save us because He loves us. Jesus rose from the dead. One day, He will come back to rule as King forever. (Option: Read Phil. 2:5-8.)*

How can you be part of God’s plan? *Prompt kids to discuss ways they are uniquely gifted to serve and help others in their neighborhood or community. Talk about how God has a purpose for our lives now—right where we are—to share God’s love and the gospel. We might not know God’s exact plan, but we can help others and faithfully share with them the good news about Jesus. (Option: Read Ps. 138:8.)*

SAY • God has a plan and a purpose for each of us. Esther was obedient to God even though it was hard. God wants to use you to do big things for Him and to tell others about His great love for them. God gave Esther courage to make a difference for Him and God can give you courage too!

REFLECTION AND PRAYER

(Bible Story Coloring Page - 1 per kid, crayons)



Ask the kids the following questions:

What does this story teach me about God?

What does this story teach me about myself?

Who can I tell about this story?

Make time for prayer requests and pray for your group. If time allows, have kids to complete the Bible story coloring page provided with this session.

CONNECT WITH PARENTS/INFLUENCERS

(Younger Kids Activity Page, 1 per kid)

Hand each K/1st kid a Younger Kids Activity Page and encourage them to do it at home with their family this week.
